What is EuRoQuod?



The National Network of Coordinating Judges in the Field of European Union Law

Judges :

- all levels of jurisdiction
- voluntary basis
- interest in the application of EU law
- no exemption from judicial duties and no financial benefits

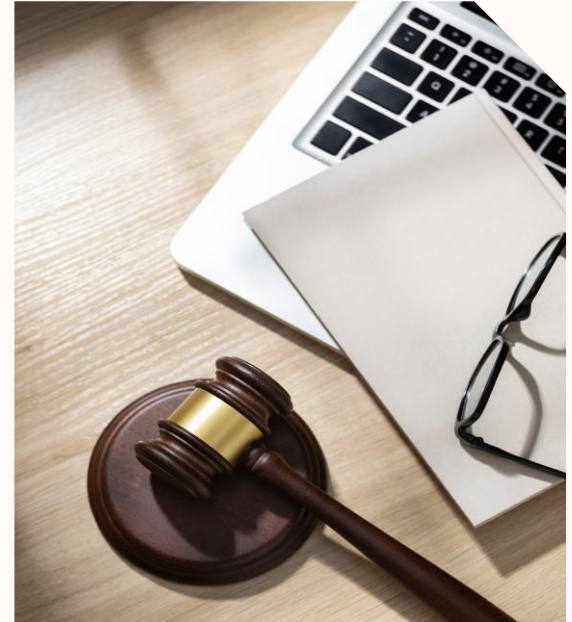
! They are willing to share their experience with their colleagues.



Legal basis

- the initiative of the National Institute of Magistracy (INM)
- approved by the Plenum of the Superior Council of Magistracy (Decision no. 520/14 June 2012)
- initially – one judge from each Court of Appeal and each section of the High Court of Cassation and Justice –19 judges
- later –judges from all levels of jurisdiction

Dutch example – EURINFRA



How many judges?

▶ **2012** – 19 judges one judge from each Court of Appeal (15 courts) and from each Division of the High Court of Justice (4 Divisions).

▶ **Today** – 78 judges

▶ **Future** – 240 judges

Ensures **communication and coherence** within the network

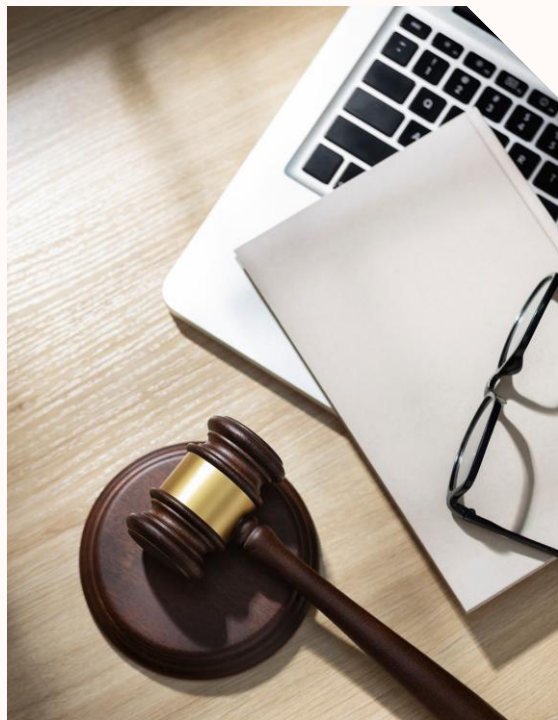


Acts as the **main contact point** between EuRoQuod and the National Institute of Magistracy (NIM)

Achievements(2)

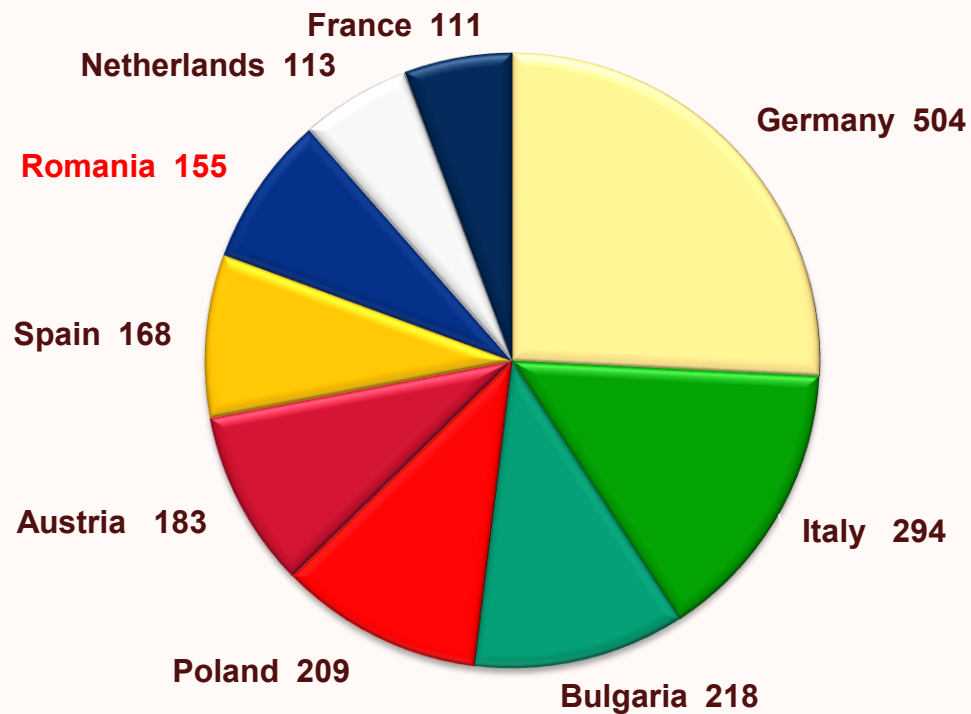
EuRoQuod Database Project

- **All preliminary reference requests** originating from Romania
- **Main advantages:**
 - direct access to the corresponding national court case file
 - includes national court decisions issued after the judgments of the CJEU;
 - **Enhance transparency, accessibility, and knowledge sharing** among judges handling cases involving EU law.
