#### Registration fee

There is no registration fee.

Travel and accommodation

Participants will receive a <u>fixed contribution</u> towards their travel expenses and will be asked to book their own travel after receiving confirmation from ERA. The condition for payment of this contribution is to sign <u>all</u> attendance sheets at the event. No supporting documents are needed.
